

Concurrent Enrollment Policies

Admissions Requirements

High school Juniors and Seniors, Home Schooled students (having completed coursework equivalent for Junior standing), or students attending an Unaccredited High School (having completed coursework equivalent to Junior standing) who meet the eligibility requirements and admissions standards can enroll in college courses. Student must have one of the following for admission:

- Minimum National ACT, Pre-ACT, or Residual¹ ACT composite score of 19, OR
- Minimum SAT, PSAT 10, or PSAT/NMSQT of 990, OR
- Unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 or higher.

¹Students can utilize one residual ACT score per year (Nov. 1 – Oct. 31). Residual ACT scores are valid only at the institution at which it is administered.

Required Documents

All required documents must be received before a student is accepted for admission to concurrent enrollment.

- Free application for admission: Visit <https://apply.osuokc.edu/apply> to apply.
- High School Concurrent Enrollment Form must be completed and signed as indicated.
- Transcripts: most recent official high school transcript and a transcript from each college or university previously attended (if applicable).
- Official ACT or SAT scores.

Course Placement

Admission to OSU-OKC does not guarantee eligibility for course placement. At a minimum, students must demonstrate college readiness in reading (ACT 19/SAT 510/Accuplacer Reading \geq 250). Students must also meet the following score requirements in the subject area in which they are enrolling:

⁴Many courses have more than one code as prerequisite. For example: English Comp I (ENGL1113) has both an [R] and [W] requirement. Students must meet all prerequisites for enrollment. ⁵If there is no Science equivalent, students must have both [R] and [M] to meet [SCI] requirement.

Course Enrollment Limits / Workload

OSRHE policy limits high school students to a maximum of 19 semester credit hours without special approval. *For calculation purposes, each High School Course, excluding activities or performance courses, is 3 credit hours equivalent. Each OSU-OKC Course credit hours are noted by the last number in the course.

Continued Enrollment

Students must maintain a cumulative college GPA of 2.0 or above, on a 4.0 scale, to enroll in subsequent semesters. Students whose cumulative college GPA falls below 2.0 are not eligible to enroll in college courses until after high school graduation. Please note: Grades earned through concurrent enrollment are posted to the official transcript and become a part of the student's college record. Therefore, scholarships, grants, and other forms of aid – including Oklahoma's Promise – that depend on GPA may be adversely affected if a student fails to maintain the appropriate GPA requirements.
