

Clint Chambers



Clint Chambers graduated from Chickasha High School in 1950. Clint was born in Chickasha. After graduating from Chickasha High School, Mr. Chambers attended Baylor University graduating in 1954. He then attended the University of Oklahoma Medical School. After completing his internship at Mercy Hospital in Oklahoma City, he served on a volunteer medical team in Cambodia from 1960-1962. In 1962, he entered the Air Force and completed residencies in such countries as Taiwan, Vietnam, Thailand, and Germany. As an Air Force Colonel, he retired from active duty in 1984.

After 1984, Dr. Chambers had a private surgical practice in Lubbock, Texas. While there he served as the President of the Lubbock County Medical Society and Sheriff of the Llano Estacado Corral of Westerners and Vice-President of the West Texas Historical Association. In 1989-1991, Dr. Chambers became the Chief of Surgery at Methodist Hospital in Lubbock, Texas.

Clint has held teaching appointments at Texas Tech University School of Medicine in Lubbock and is an Associate Clinical Professor in the Department of Surgery. Dr. Chambers has many publications and has presented at numerous symposiums over the years.

Dr. Chambers was inducted into the Chickasha High School Hall of Fame in 2000.
